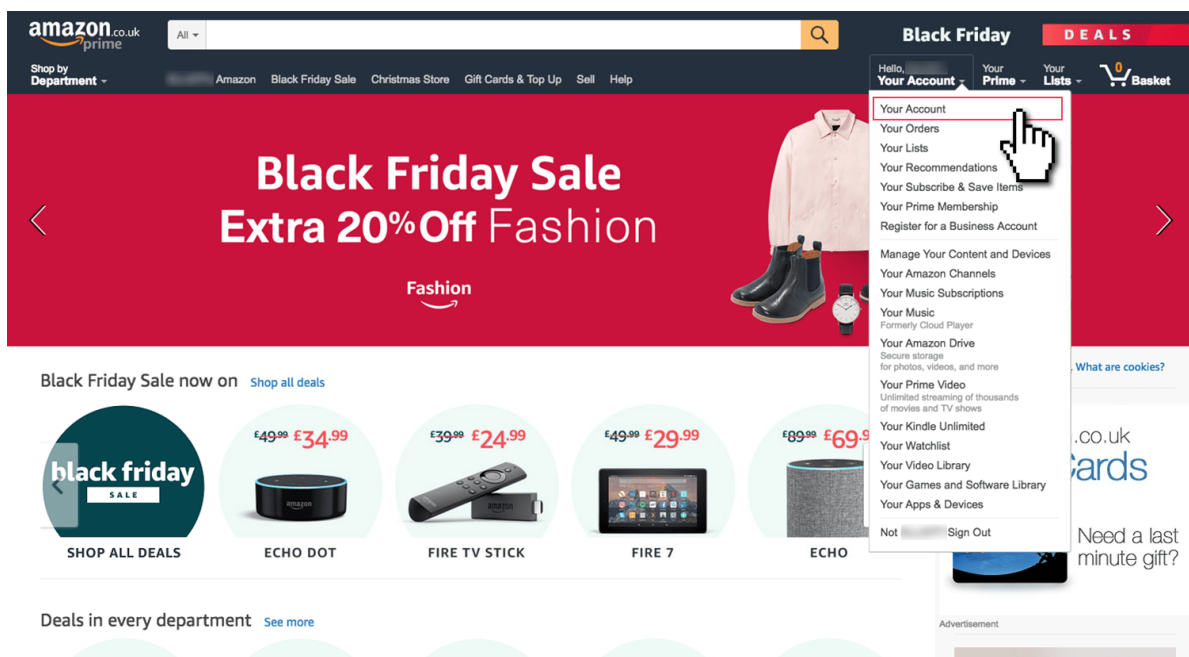

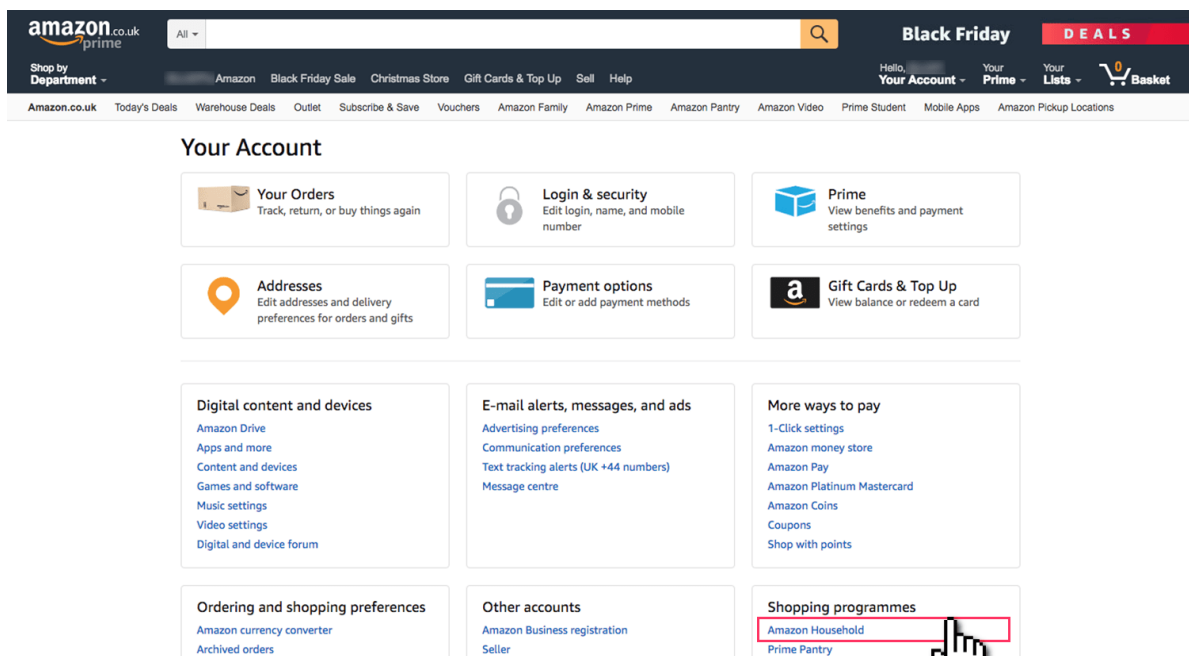

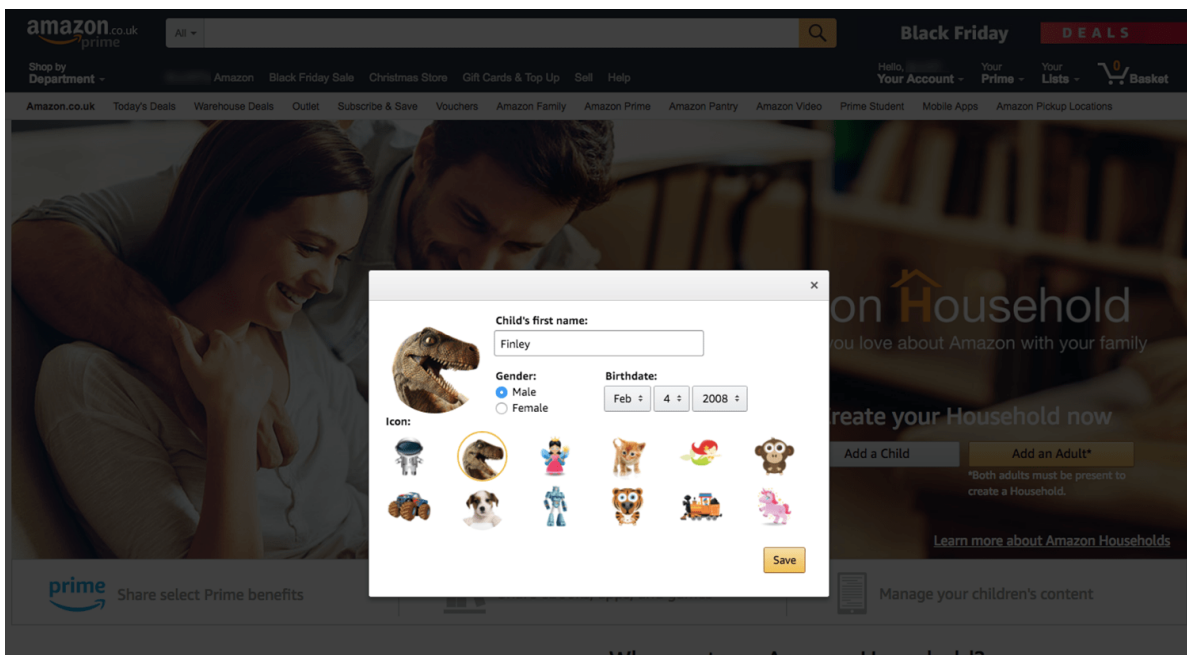

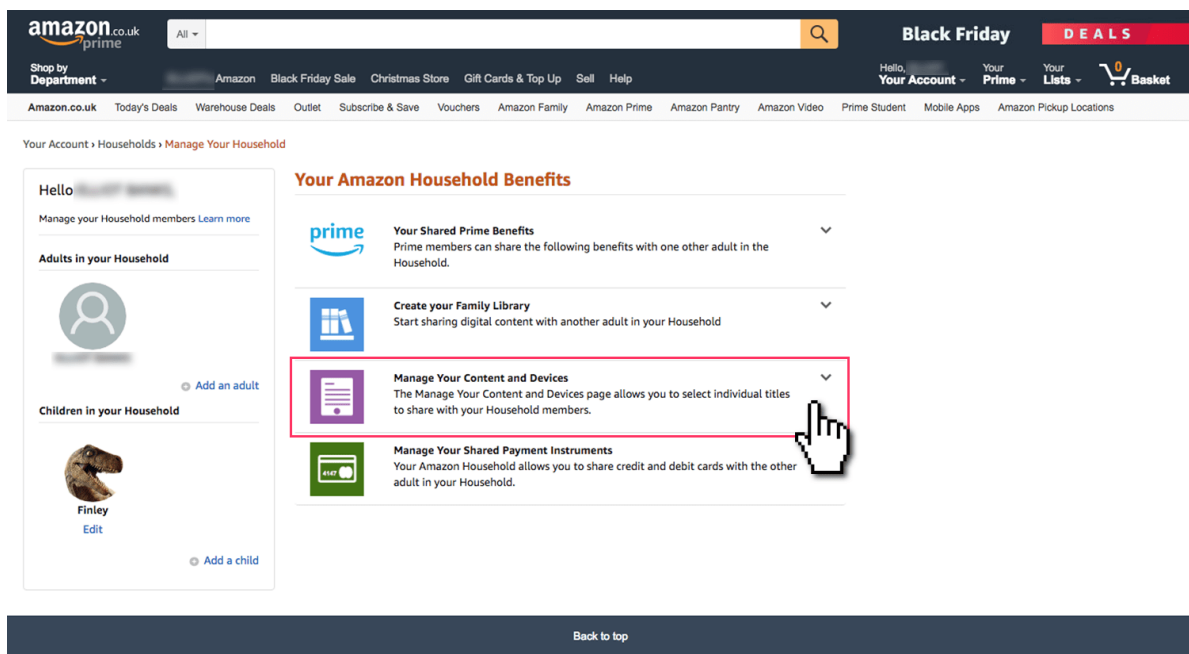

Click on 'Manage Your Content and Devices' to control what purchased content your child can access and on what device.



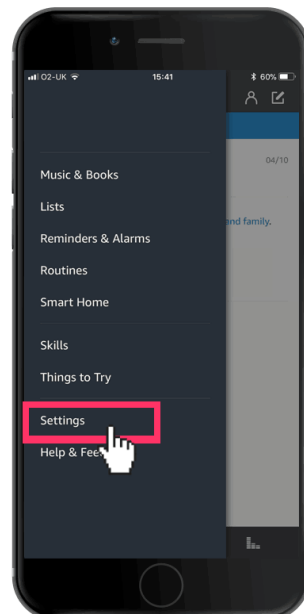

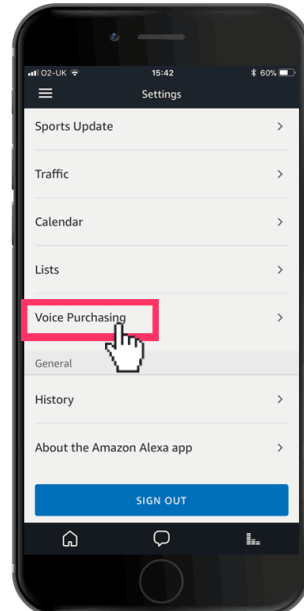
